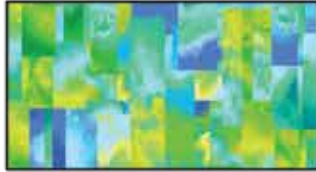

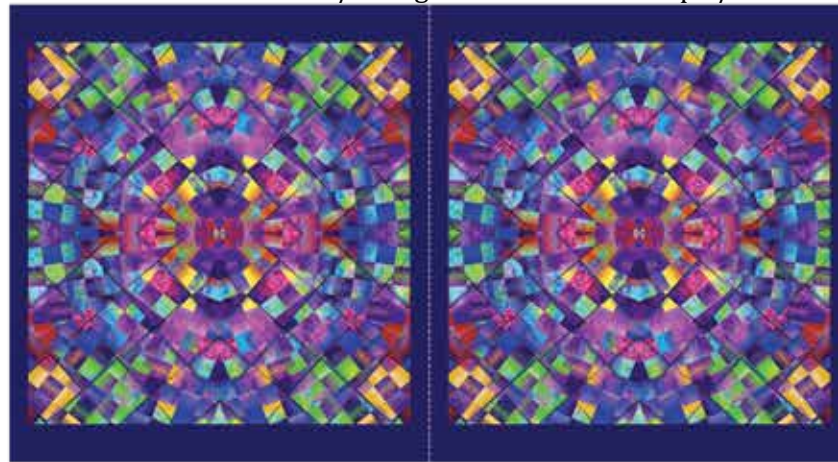

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5444P-79 Starburst Kaleidoscope – Royal/Multi), fussy cut:

- (1) 6" square, centered on very middle of a panel.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (16) 3 5/8" squares, (4) 3 1/4" x 6" strips, and (4) 3 1/4" squares, each as parallel to straight sides of design as possible. Cut the 3 5/8" squares across (1) diagonal to make (32) 3 5/8" triangles.

Fabric B (1351-Cream Just Color! – Cream), cut:

- (3) 3 3/4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (28) 3 3/4" squares.
- (6) 3 3/4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (56) 3 3/4" triangles.
- (2) 3 5/8" WOF strips, sub-cut (22) 3 5/8" squares. Cut (16) of the squares across (1) diagonal to make (32) 3 5/8" triangles.
- (1) 3 1/4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 3 1/4" x 6" strips.
- (6) 3 1/4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (72) 3 1/4" squares.
- (10) 1 7/8" x WOF strips, sub-cut (200) 1 7/8" squares.

Fabric C (1351-Grape Just Color! – Grape), cut:

- (1) 3 1/4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 3 1/4" squares.
- (1) 1 7/8" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 1 7/8" x 3 3/8" strips.

Fabric D (5437-79 Mardi Gras Beads – Royal/Multi), cut:

- (1) 3 1/4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 3 1/4" squares.

Fabric E (1351-Plum Just Color! – Plum), cut:

- (1) 3 1/4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 3 1/4" squares.

Fabric F (5443-57 Splash – Purple/Teal), cut:

- (1) 3 3/4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 3/4" squares and (8) 3 1/4" squares.

Fabric G (5440-79 Triangulation – Royal/Multi), cut:

- (2) 4" x 28" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 4" x 35" WOF strips, piece as needed.

Fabric H (5441-79 Confetti Blooms – Royal/Multi), cut:

- (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (14) 4 1/2" squares.

Fabric I (5442-57 Ombre Bars – Purple/Teal), cut:

- (1) 3 3/4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 3 3/4" squares.

Fabric J (1351-Forest Just Color! – Forest), cut:

- (1) 1 7/8" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 1 7/8" x 3 3/8" strips.

Cutting - Continued

Fabric K (1351-Teal Just Color! – Teal), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares, and (4) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " strips.

Fabric L (1351-Orange Just Color! – Orange), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares and (2) 3 $\frac{5}{8}$ " squares.
- (1) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " strips.

Fabric M (5438-79 Ticker Tape Parade – Royal/Multi), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares and (8) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " strips.
- (5) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (28) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " strips.

Fabric N (5443-35 Splash – Yellow/Orange), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares.

Fabric O (1351-Aegean Blue Just Color! – Aegean Blue), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares and (8) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " strips.

Fabric P (5442-76 Ombre Bars – Blue/Green), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares.

Fabric Q (1351-Carnation Just Color! – Carnation), cut:

- (1) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " strips.

Fabric R (1351-Lipstick Just Color! – Lipstick), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares.
- (1) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " strips.

Fabric S (5439-79 Confetti Flowers – Royal/Multi), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares, (4) 3 $\frac{5}{8}$ " squares, and (4) 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares.
- (6) 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " strips.
- (4) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (72) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.
- (6) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric T (1351-Red Delicious Just Color! – Red Delicious), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares and (8) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " strips.

Fabric U (1351-Royal Just Color! – Royal), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares.

Fabric V (1351-Grass Just Color! – Grass), cut:

- (1) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " strips.

Backing (5440-11 Triangulation – White/Multi), cut:

- (2) 65" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 65" x 65" to make the back.

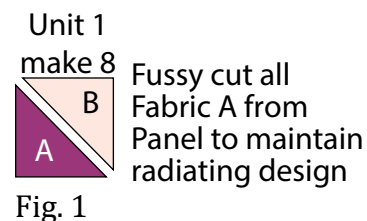
Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

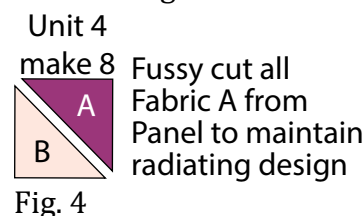
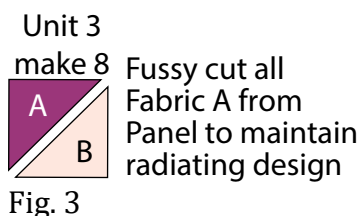
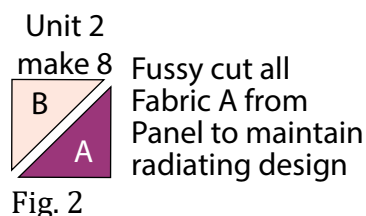
Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

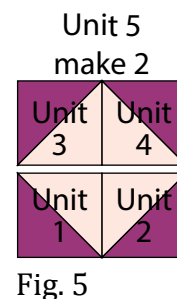
1. Sew (1) $3\frac{5}{8}$ " Fabric A triangle and (1) $3\frac{5}{8}$ " Fabric B triangle together along their long sides as shown in Figure 1 to make (1) Unit 1 square. The unit should measure $3\frac{1}{4}$ " square. Repeat to make (8) Unit 1 squares total.



2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figures 2-4 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (8) Unit 2 squares, (8) Unit 3 squares and (8) Unit 4 squares.



3. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the left side of (1) Unit 4 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to the left side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make a second Unit 5 square.



4. Sew together (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B square, (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Unit 2 square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6" Fabric B strip, (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Unit 2 square and (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 6).

5. Sew together (1) Unit 4 square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6" Fabric A strip, (1) Unit 3 square, (1) Unit 4 square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6" Fabric A strip and (1) Unit 3 square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 6).

6. Sew together (1) Unit 2 square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric A square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B square, (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Unit 2 square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric A square and (1) Unit 1 square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Three (Fig. 6).

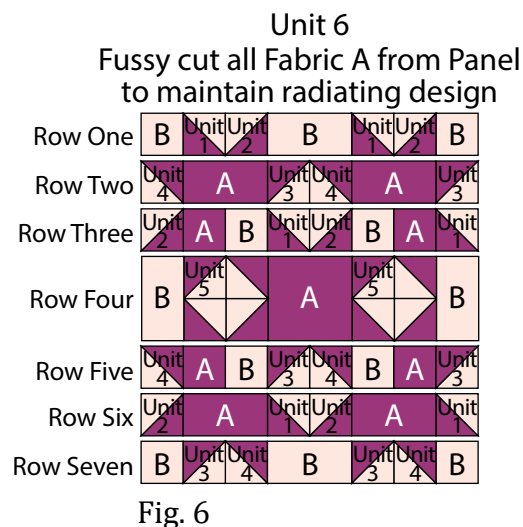
7. Sew together (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6" Fabric B strip, (1) Unit 5 square, (1) 6" Fabric A square, (1) Unit 5 square and (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6" Fabric B strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row Four (Fig. 6).

8. Sew together (1) Unit 4 square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric A square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B square, (1) Unit 3 square, (1) Unit 4 square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric A square and (1) Unit 3 square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Five (Fig. 6).

9. Sew together (1) Unit 2 square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6" Fabric A strip, (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Unit 2 square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6" Fabric A strip and (1) Unit 1 square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Six (Fig. 6).

10. Sew together (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B square, (1) Unit 3 square, (1) Unit 4 square, (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6" Fabric B strip, (1) Unit 3 square, (1) Unit 4 square and (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Seven (Fig. 6).

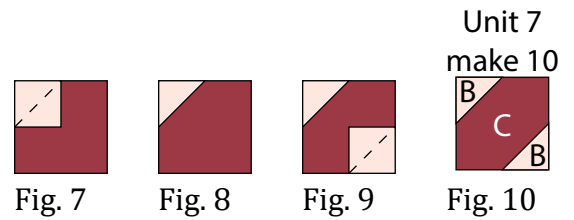
11. Sew the (7) rows from Steps 4-10 together, in numerical order, to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 6).



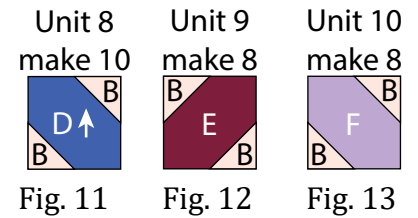
12. Place (1) 1 7/8" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) 3 1/4" Fabric C square, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 8).

13. Follow Figure 9 for the seam direction to add a 1 7/8" Fabric B square to the lower right corner of the 3 1/4" Fabric C square to make (1) Unit 7 square (Fig. 10).

14. Repeat Steps 12-13 to make (10) Unit 7 squares total.



15. Repeat Steps 12-13 and refer to Figures 11-13 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (10) Unit 8 squares, (8) Unit 9 squares and (8) Unit 10 squares.

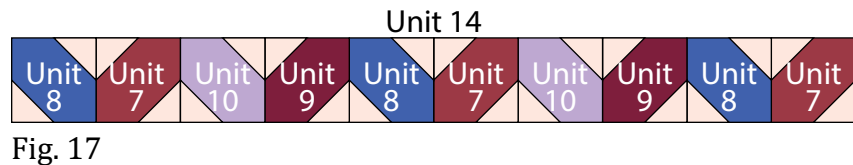
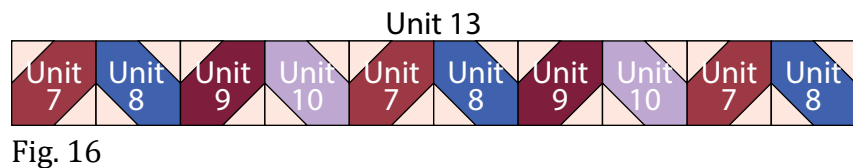
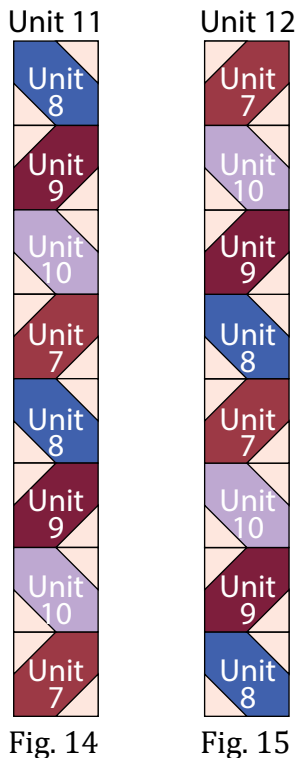


16. Follow Figure 14 and sew together (8) assorted unit squares to make (1) Unit 11 strip.

17. Follow Figure 15 and sew together (8) assorted unit squares to make (1) Unit 12 strip.

18. Follow Figure 16 and sew together (10) assorted unit squares to make (1) Unit 13 strip.

19. Follow Figure 17 and sew together (10) assorted unit squares to make (1) Unit 14 strip.



20. Sew the Unit 11 strip to the left side of the Unit 6 square. Sew the Unit 12 strip to the right side of the Unit 6 square. Sew the Unit 13 strip to the top of the Unit 6 square and the Unit 14 strip to the bottom of the Unit 6 square to make the Center Block (Fig. 18). The block should measure 28" square.

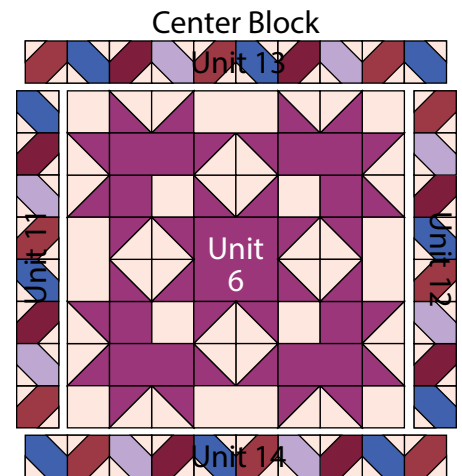

21. Sew (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric B triangle to the upper left and lower right sides of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square on point (Fig. 19). Sew (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric B triangle to the upper right and lower left sides of the Fabric H square (Fig. 20) to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 21). The unit should measure $6\frac{1}{4}$ " square. Repeat to make (14) Block One squares total.

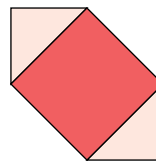

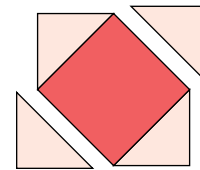

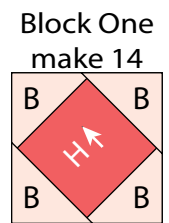

22. Place (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " Q square on top of (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric B square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 22). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 22). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 23) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $3\frac{3}{8}$ " square to make (2) Unit 15 squares (Fig. 24). Repeat to make (4) Unit 15 squares total.

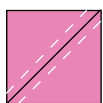

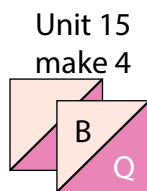

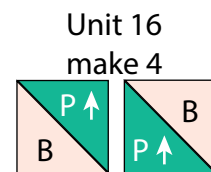

23. Place (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " B square on top of (1) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric P square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 25). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 25). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 26) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $3\frac{3}{8}$ " square to make (2) Unit 16 squares (Fig. 27). Repeat to make (4) Unit 16 squares total.

24. Sew (1) Unit 15 square to the left side of (1) Unit 16 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 16 square to the left side of (1) Unit 15 square to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 28). Repeat to make a second Block Two square.

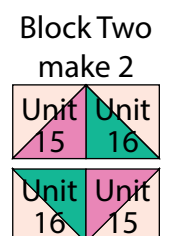

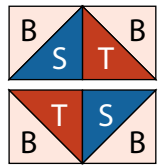

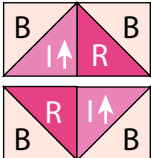

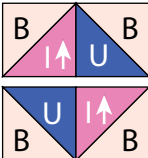

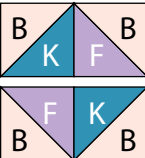

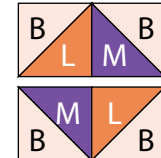

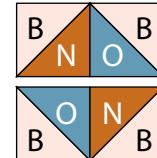

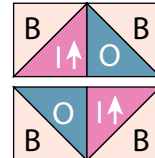

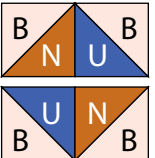

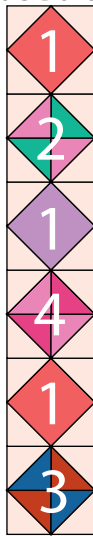

Inner Top Border

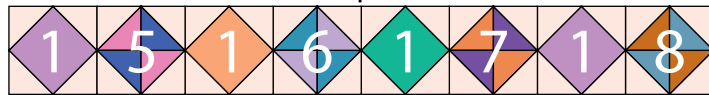

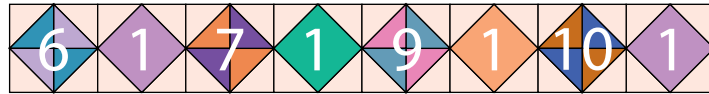

28. Place (1) 1 7/8" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 1 7/8" x 3 3/8" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 41). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 41). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 17 strip (Fig. 42). Repeat to make (12) Unit 17 strips total.

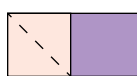

30. Repeat Step 28 and refer to Figure 53 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction while using (28) 1 7/8" x 6 1/4" Fabric M strips and (56) 1 7/8" Fabric B squares to make (28) Unit 28 strips.

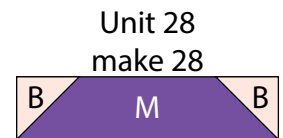

31. Follow Figure 54 and sew together (16) assorted unit strips to make the top row. Sew together (7) Unit 28 strips together end to end. Sew (1) Unit 26 strip to the left end of the newly sewn strip and (1) Unit 27 strip to the right end to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together to make (1) Unit 29 strip. Repeat to make (4) Unit 29 strips total.

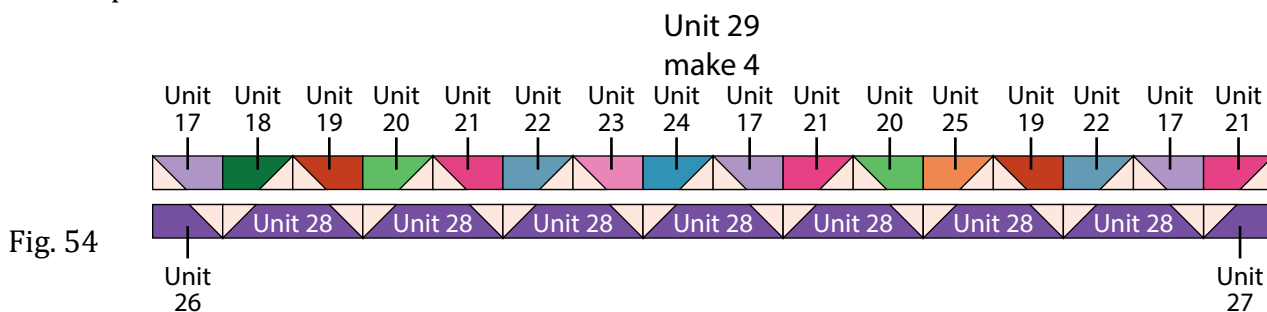

32. Repeat Step 22 and refer to Figure 55 for fabric identification and placement while using (2) 3 5/8" Fabric B squares and (2) 3 5/8" Fabric L squares to make (4) 3 1/4" Unit 30 squares.

33. Place (1) 1 7/8" Fabric M square on the bottom right corner of (1) Unit 30 square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 31 square (Fig. 57). Repeat to make (4) Unit 31 squares total.

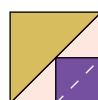

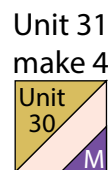

34. Sew (1) Unit 31 square to each end of (1) Unit 29 strip to make (1) Unit 32 strip (Fig. 58). Repeat to make a second Unit 32 strip.

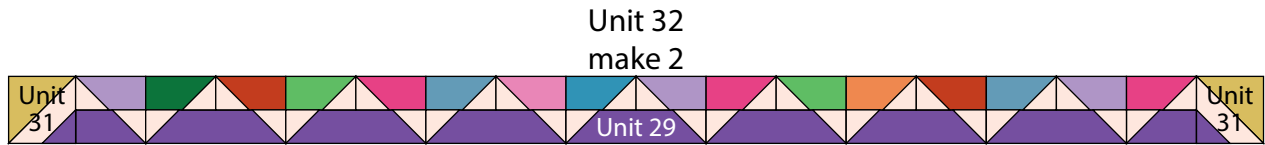

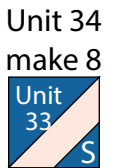

36. Repeat Step 33 and refer to Figure 60 to add (1) 1 7/8" Fabric S square to the lower right corner of (1) Unit 33 square to make (1) Unit 34 square. Repeat to make (8) Unit 34 squares total.

37. Place (1) 3 1/4" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 3 1/4" x 6 1/4" Fabric S strip, right sides together (Fig. 61). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 61). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 62).

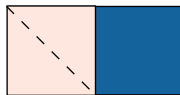

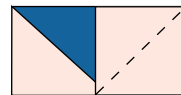

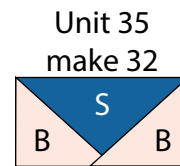

38. Place another 3 1/4" Fabric B square on the right side of the 3 1/4" x 6 1/4" Fabric S strip, right sides together (Fig. 63). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 63). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 35 strip (Fig. 64).

39. Repeat Steps 37-38 too make (32) Unit 35 strips total.

40. Repeat Step 33 and refer to Figure 65 for seam direction to add (1) 1 7/8" Fabric S square to the lower left and lower right corners of (1) Unit 35 strip make (1) Unit 36 strip. Repeat to make (32) Unit 36 strips total.

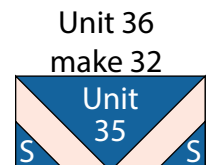

41. Sew together (8) Unit 36 strips together end to end. Sew (1) Unit 34 square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 37 strip (Fig. 66). Repeat to make (4) Unit 37 strips total.

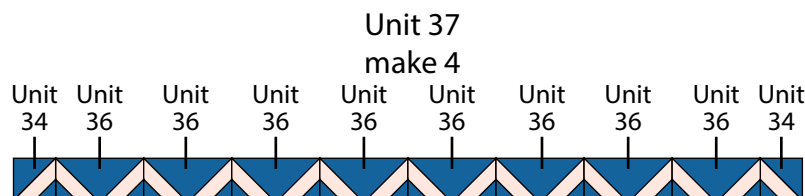

42. Sew (1) 3 ¼" Fabric S squares to each end of (1) Unit 37 strip to make (1) Unit 38 strip (Fig. 67). Repeat to make a second Unit 38 strip.

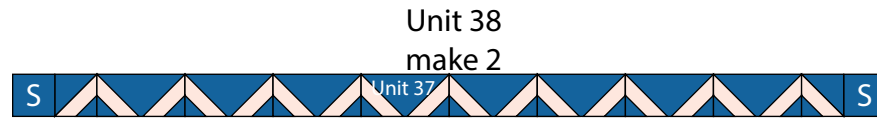

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

43. Sew (1) 4" x 28" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4" x 35" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

44. Sew the Inner Left Side Border and Inner Right Side Border to the left and to the right of the Center Block. Sew the Inner Top Border and Inner Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

45. Sew (1) Unit 29 strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) Unit 32 strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

46. Sew (1) Unit 37 to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) Unit 38 strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

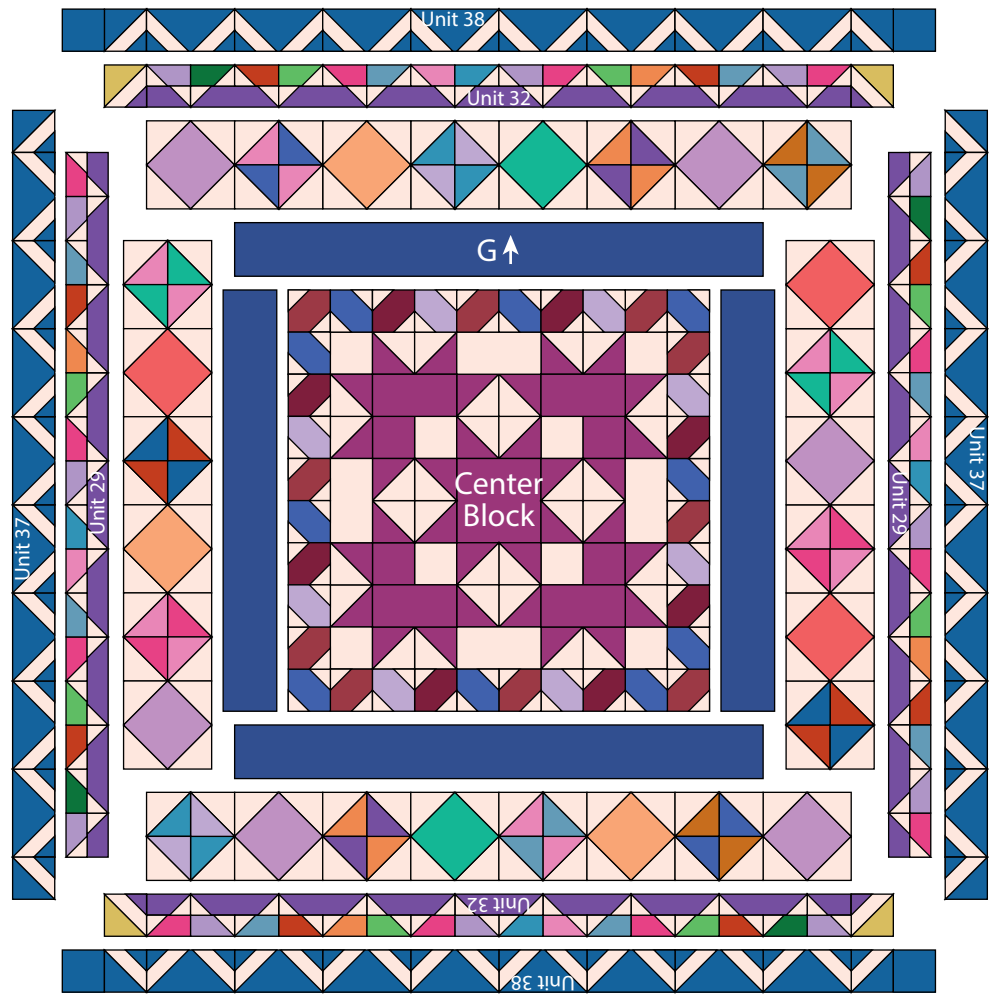
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

47. Press the quilt top and 65" x 65" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

48. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric S binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

49. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
